

Phonics Homework - 28.02.20

Sounds of the Week - graphemes that make ee

ie (the chief has a handkerchief)

e-e (Steve dresses up on Christmas eve)

y (a happy bunny)

On the other side of this piece of paper are 6 'alien' words (made-up, nonsense words) and 6 real words for your child to read at home.

Can they spot the different graphemes (written representation of the sound/phoneme e.g. ay, ai, a-e) in the words?

It will help if you add **sound buttons** to the words.

If there is a single grapheme, we draw a dot under it.

dog strap

If it is either a **digraph** or **trigraph** (two or more graphemes making one phoneme) then a line is drawn under it.

lay high

If there is a split digraph we draw an arc over the graphemes representing the phoneme.

Once you have drawn all of the sound buttons, you can then blend the graphemes to read the words.

Below are some examples on how to **blend**:

e.g. d-o-g → dog

th-r-ee → three

h-air → hair
